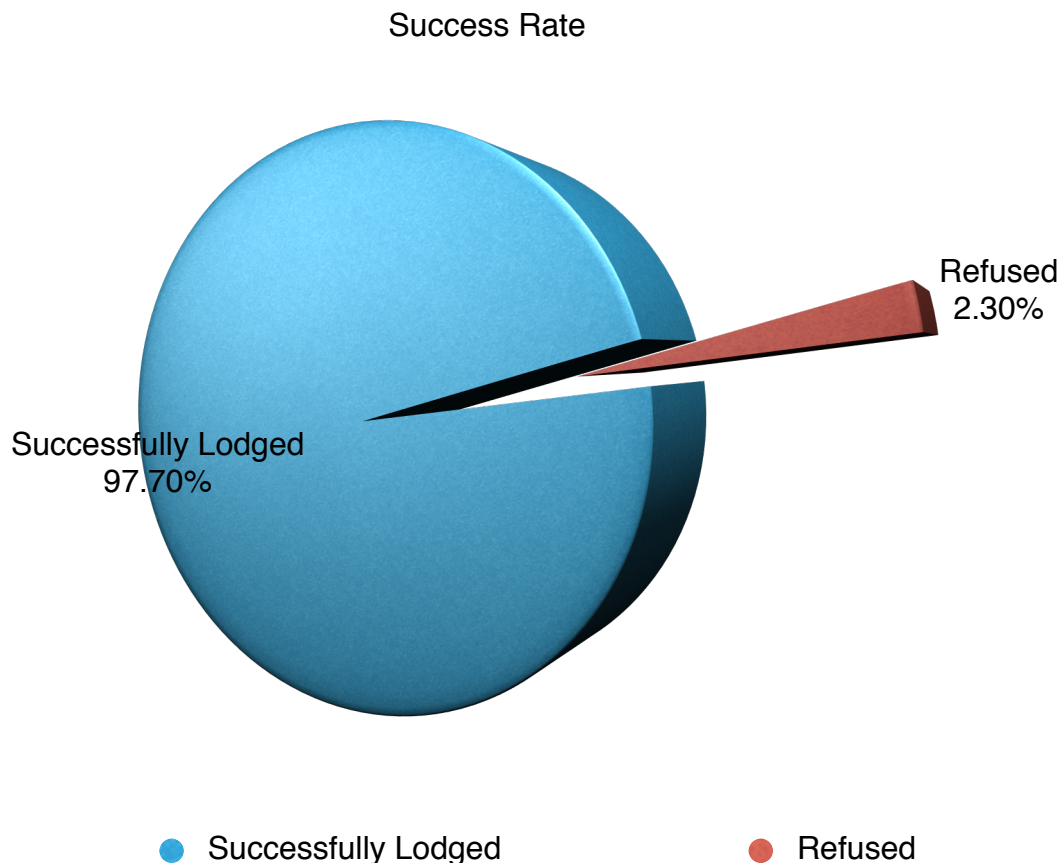

## Findings – All Lodged Applications

The Success Rate Survey conducted resulted in the following findings with regards to the number of visa applications that were lodged between 1<sup>st</sup> of January 2010 to 31<sup>st</sup> of December 2010:

**97.7% Success Rate**

**2.3% Failure rate**
